The case in front of the Board was 2019-a-7. Susan spoke to the Board regarding the property located at 296 Valley Rd, Corydon, also known as the WPA Building on Rice Island. The Town of Corydon was asking for a complete variance from the 50% floodplain rule due to the historic nature of this property. The Board asked if the building was designated an historic structure.
